

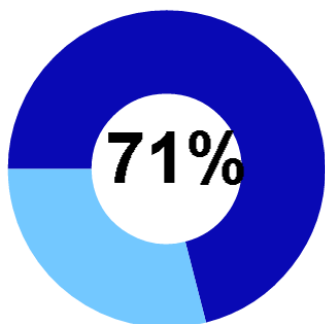

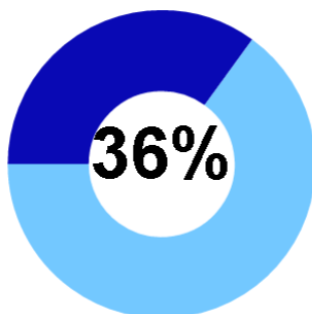
## New York State Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Funding Facts

From the NY FFY 2014 CSBG Information System Survey

71 % of NY families served were in poverty, below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



35% of NY families served were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



The CSBG Network in New York State provided services to:



787,976 low-income individuals

### Vulnerable populations served included:



360,084 children



44,481 people with disabilities



57,672 seniors



126,434 people who lacked health insurance

The CSBG is unique among federal programs in that it is the only comprehensive investment exclusively focused on reducing poverty.
