Sexual Assault Awareness Month

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the United Community Corporation (UCC) Cafe

A <u>recent article details</u> the debut of "UCC Café Mobile Food Pantry" program. The initiative features a food truck equipped to serve prepared and packaged meals directly to individuals facing food insecurity. The project was launched to meet the needs of the community, help overcome the barriers of transportation encountered by low-income residents and eliminate the stigma of going to a food pantry or soup kitchen.

The new initiative follows suit with another recent effort UCC has led to address food insecurity, establishing a <u>community fridge in the city's East Ward</u>. The unit provides residents around-the-clock access to staple goods such as milk, juice, cheese, fresh fruits and vegetables, all at no cost. In celebration of next week's UCC Café ribbon-cutting, organization officials will debut another community fridge at South 8th Street.

Putting a second community fridge directly in one of the city's most vulnerable neighborhoods also helps expand this effort to reach as many residents as possible. <u>UCC</u>'s first fridge in the East Ward has already helped serve more than 5,000 residents since its launch. The UCC Café was funded by the <u>Community Service Block Grant CARES Act Rapid-</u> <u>Cycle Impact Projec</u>t, an initiative aimed to address immediate needs in communities.

New York State Community Action Association (NYSCAA)



In February, NYSCAA hosted the RPIC Region II Regional Convening. This virtual event brought together over 140 representatives from Community Action Agencies in Region II. Participants gathered to learn about Human Capacity & Community Transformation (HCCT) initiatives in Region II. We were excited to come together around these innovative initiatives to connect, learn, collaborate, and identify opportunities for replication and capacity building. From New York:

- <u>Chautauqua Opportunities for Development, Inc. (CODI)</u>: An affiliate corporation of Chautauqua Opportunities, Inc., CODI was formed in 2003 to provide borrowing opportunities to business start-ups and existing businesses that may otherwise not be eligible for such borrowing opportunities through traditional lenders. These businesses subsequently provide the community with employment opportunities and engaging products & services, which improve the quality of life and the choices available locally. Since its inception, CODI has provided 91 business loans to entrepreneurs who otherwise would not have obtained funding for their business.
- Connecting Communities in Action (CCA) Fatherhood Connection Pilot: The NYS Department of State (DOS) used CSBG Discretionary resources to fund a pilot project to create, sustain, and evaluate a Fatherhood Connection Pilot program. The Fatherhood Connection assists in creating a firm foundation for the men in the community through the facilitation of men's parenting and personal development groups to increase selfsufficiency and self-awareness. CCA was one of three CAAs to participate in a train-thetrainer program where staff become trained and certified as new facilitators during the delivery of a 13-week Fatherhood Connection cohort. During these 13 week sessions, participants were expected to strengthen their understanding of fatherhood roles, improve parenting skills, learn communication techniques and anger management, discuss blended families and co-parenting, address domestic violence, and become more engaged in the lives of their children. Five facilitators were trained across a threecounty area and held groups independently. Of the fifty-one fathers who participated, thirty graduated and increased their parenting skills, made connections with their parenting style, handled anger more effectively when frustrated, and identified areas where they need to improve communication with children, caretakers, mothers, and the judicial system.



United States Census Bureau: New Statistics Available From the 2016–2020 ACS 5-Year Estimates

In March, the U.S. Census Bureau released new statistics from the 20162020 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates. Following pandemic-related data collection disruptions, the Census Bureau revised its methodology to reduce nonresponse bias in data collected in 2020. After evaluating the effectiveness of this methodology, the Census Bureau determined the standard, full suite of 20162020 ACS 5-year data are fit for public release, government and business uses. These statistics boost the understanding of the social and economic characteristics of the U.S. population.
