U.S. Sen. Cory Booker celebrated a major win in the fight against food insecurity Tuesday when he delivered \$1.05 million to Norwescap Food Bank in Phillipsburg. The money is part of a larger package of spending approved by Congress called appropriations "earmarks", which allows members of Congress to dedicate spending to community projects. Norwescap will use the money to expand its services, including redesigning a warehouse.

Participants gathered to learn about Human Capacity & Community Transformation (HCCT) initiatives in Region II. We were excited to come together around these innovative initiatives to connect, learn, collaborate, and identify opportunities for replication and capacity building. ### Highlighted Initiatives from Jersey:

 <u>New Jersey Association on Correction (NJAC) - Fatherhood Program</u>: The New Jersey Association on Correction is headquartered in Trenton, New Jersey, and serves seven counties in the state. In 2020, NJAC was awarded a 5-year grant from the DHHS Administration for Children and Families funded their Fatherhood Family focused, Interconnected, Resilient, and Essential (Fatherhood FIRE) program. The Fatherhood Program merges NJAC's two areas of expertise, helping returning citizens to successfully reenter the community and promoting positive family relationships. The long-term goals of the program are to improve family functioning improved family functioning, including: improved couple relationships, marriage, and stability; and improved parenting and coparenting; improve adult and child well being; increase economic stability and mobility; reduce poverty; and reduce recidivism. To date, 55 fathers have been enrolled and 35 have graduated from the program.

### Ten Ways OCS is Working to Mitigate Heat Stress

The threat of extreme weather is disproportionately <u>felt by</u> <u>communities of color, lower-income households, and</u> <u>vulnerable populations</u> as they are more likely to live in <u>"urban heat islands"</u> and are often unable to afford adequate air conditioning. As we grapple with a summer with abovenormal temperatures in most of the country, it is imperative to understand not only the impact of heat stress on the individuals, families, and communities we serve, but how grant recipients can utilize OCS programs and flexibility to mitigate the impact of extreme weather and heat stress on vulnerable populations.

This <u>Dear Colleague Letter</u> issued by the Office of Community Services (OCS) outlines ten steps OCS has taken to raise awareness about and address heat stress this year.

### U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development: Notice of Funding Opportunity to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development

(HUD) has issued a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to target efforts to reduce unsheltered homelessness, particularly in communities with very high levels of unsheltered homelessness and homelessness in rural areas. Through this Special NOFO, HUD will award funding to communities to implement coordinated approaches grounded in Housing First and public health principles — to reduce the prevalence of unsheltered homelessness, and improve services engagement, health outcomes, and housing stability among highly vulnerable unsheltered individuals and families. The application deadline is October 20, 2022.
